SMALL ANIMAL SHOW RULES

1. The Local and State Rules, found on our website www.sdfair.com, apply to this Department. Please read them carefully.
2. **ELIGIBILITY:**
OPEN DIVISIONS: Open to exhibitors, 18 years of age or older, who are residents of the United States and minors who are out of state residents.
YOUTH DIVISIONS: Open to youth exhibitors, 9 - 17 years of age, who are residents of California. 4H, Grange or FFA exhibitors are governed by 4H/Grange/FFA eligibility and age rules. Indicate age and 4H/Grange/FFA Club or Chapter on the entry form. **Primary:** All youths 5 - 8 years of age are limited to primary classes. See State Rule VII-7 for age requirement explanation.
3. **REGISTRATION DEADLINE: ENTRY FORM DEADLINE:** Late entries will not be accepted. No Faxes.
 - **On-line registration:** Entries must be submitted at www.sdfair.com/entry by 11:59pm (PT) on Wednesday, May 12. On-line entries will receive e-mail confirmation.
 - **Mail in registration:** Completed forms and fees must be USPS postmarked on or before Wednesday, May 12. You will not receive a return receipt.
 - **Hand delivered registration:** Completed forms must be delivered to the Livestock Office, during normal office hours, until the deadline, Wednesday, May 12, at 5:00pm.
4. **LIMIT OF ENTRIES:** There is no limit of entries, unless otherwise noted. The State Rules specify that husband and wife are considered one exhibitor.
5. **“NEW” PROCESSING FEES:** Rabbits, Cavies, Pigeons and Poultry are **\$2** per entry, including posters. Showmanship is **\$8.00**. Processing fees are nonrefundable.
6. **CHECK-IN & RELEASE: All animals must be checked in with the Supervisor before caging.** Only animals properly entered, or for special display purposes, will be permitted in the show. Livestock personnel will check the animal(s) and release form before departure. Release forms will be issued to exhibitors or their authorized agents only.
7. **JUDGING:** American System of judging will be used, unless otherwise noted. The aisles will be closed during judging. Any person interfering with the judge or judging in any way will have their animals disqualified.
8. No person will be permitted to handle exhibits during the show without permission of the show officials.
9. **AWARDS: OPEN & YOUTH DIVISIONS:**
1st - \$7.00 2nd - \$6.00 3rd - \$5.00
Classes judged Danish receive no premiums, unless otherwise stated.
Per State Rule # **IV 6** No exhibitor shall receive more than 2 cash awards in one class.
Trophy for Best of Show and Reserve of Show.
The following awards are offered to the 5 breeds having the largest number of entries:
Rosettes to the Best of Breed for each of the first 5 breeds. (Rabbits, Cavies, Poultry)
Rosettes to the Best Opposite of Breed for each of the first 5 breeds. (Rabbits, Cavies, Poultry)
10. **HEALTH:** Any animal showing evidence of illness will be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds, including mites, lice, and fleas. Any disabled animal will be refused and must be removed from the Fairgrounds. All chickens or turkeys exhibited will be subject to pollorum-typhoid testing at the Fair unless: Chickens or turkeys come from flocks which are certified as California United States pollorum-typhoid clean or its equivalent; or individual birds entered are accompanied by an official health certificate identifying such poultry and showing a negative pollorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to entry. Pollorum-typhoid certification may be obtained from agents of the National Poultry and Turkey Improvement Plans or accredited veterinarians. **All poultry will be inspected prior to being cooped.**

SMALL ANIMAL SHOW RULES

- 11. FEED AND CARE:** Fair personnel will feed and water animals with feed provided by the Fair. Exhibitors who do not want the Fair to feed their animal must obtain an "OWNER WILL FEED & WATER" sign from the supervisor. Cavy exhibitors must provide a plain water bottle (new in appearance) with wire or spring hanger for each animal entered. If there is no water bottle present at check-in the animal will be sent home.
- 12.** Absolutely no cardboard or paper will be used for partitions.
- 13. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Substitutions will be made ONLY in the same class of original entry. All substitutions must be COMPLETED 24 hours before show opens. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 14. SALE OF EXHIBITS:** Exhibitors may not display more than ONE business card affixed to the TOP of cage with a "figure 8" Clip. "For Sale" signs are prohibited. Prices MAY NOT be shown anywhere in the showroom. Exhibitors who abuse this policy will lose their opportunity to display their business card.
- 15. CREDENTIAL POLICY:** Each exhibitor is authorized to purchase one badge for \$15.00. **See credential request form.** Adults-in-Charge of youth exhibitors may purchase one badge. (Limit two per family.) See badging request form. Exhibitors will be badged upon arrival ONLY. Exhibitors who do not purchase a badge will receive two courtesy passes. One parking permit will be issued per exhibitor/family. Parking permits do not guarantee a parking space.

SHOWMANSHIP REQUIREMENTS, Youth Exhibitors Only (ages as of Jan. 1, 2010):

Senior - ages 14 & over.

Intermediate - ages 11, 12 & 13.

Junior - ages 9 & 10.

Novice - First-timers, ages 9 & over.

Primary Showmanship - ages 5, 6, 7 & 8; (Ribbons only in Primary Showmanship)

Showmanship must be on the same entry form as the specie entry. Showmanship entry fee,

\$8.00 per entry. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor and entered in the proper class.

Awards offered per class, unless otherwise stated:

San Diego County Fair Showmanship Pins 1st - 4th Place; Ribbons 5th - 8th Place

POSTER CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

Open to Youth Exhibitors only. Processing fee: **\$2.00** per entry

All posters must be 22" x 28". Posters previously entered may not be entered again. Posters may be hand drawn or computer generated. Poster will be entered in Senior, Intermediate, Junior or Primary Divisions.

Each poster must include one or more of the following:

- a) A drawing or painting of a breed or variety
- b) Information about a breed or variety
- c) Special uses of a breed or variety
- d) History

Judging: Danish system of judging.

Judging Criteria: Educational Value 25%; Design 25%; Neatness 25%; Originality 25%.

NOTE: *There must be at least two competitors per class to be eligible for premiums in poster divisions.*

PIGEON RULES – OPEN

The Small Animal Show Rules and State and Local Rules apply to this Department. Please read them carefully.

1. All birds will be judged in accordance with the latest standards adopted by the leading specialty clubs of America. Where no American Standard is in vogue, the latest European Standard will be used. Only recognized colors will be considered in "Any Color" (A.C.) or "Any Other Color" (A.O.C.) Divisions. List color on entry form.
2. Any recognized breed or variety not listed will be judged as one division, regardless of number of entries, breed, variety or color. Breed and color must be specified on entry form.
3. All young birds must be identified by a current year seamless leg band of correct size, serially numbered, conforming with the entry form. Old birds must have either seamless or split prior year, serially numbered bands, conforming with the entry form. Birds will be shown and judged ONLY in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex. If no division is offered, no awards may be made. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class.

 Young Cock and Young Hen: 2010 Hatch

Note: Birmingham Rollers - Classes for flying rollers will accept flying rollers ONLY. All others will be disqualified. Classes for show rollers will accept show rollers ONLY. All others will be disqualified.

The following Special Awards are offered to the breeds having the largest number of entries:

Trophy for Best in Show and Reserve of Show.

Rosettes to the Champion of each of the first 5 breeds having the largest entry with 10 or more birds per division and of the Miscellaneous Division.

SAN DIEGO METROPOLITAN PIGEON CLUB offers Champion Trophies to any breed with 20 or more birds to Club members in Open Divisions. There will also be special awards honoring Fred Lipoufski and F.A. MacDonald.

POULTRY RULES- OPEN & YOUTH

All Poultry must be inspected prior to cooping. The Small Animal Show Rules, State and Local Rules apply to this Department. State and Local Rules are located at the back of this book.

Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc. shall apply to the San Diego County Fair Poultry Show, except in such instances where they are in conflict with State and Local Rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture and California State Law on the dubbing of Game Birds.

JUDGING: Birds will be handled only by Fair staff from the start of judging until checkout.

All birds will be shown in their natural condition. Evasions will disqualify.

Birds will not be judged if the leg band number does not correspond to the number on the coop card. The San Diego County Fair **DOES NOT** supply leg bands.

If you are a member of A.P.A., A.B.A., or any specialty-club, please state on your entry form.

Breed and variety of each bird, including bearded or non-bearded and comb type (i.e. Rhode Island Red single comb or rose comb), must be listed on entry form. Color **MUST** also be listed for any A.O.S.V. class.

Only members of the ABA are eligible for ABA awards. Dues are \$20.00 a year (\$50 for three years). New members receive a copy of the quarterly and the latest available copy of the Annual American Bantam Association Year Book which lists many advertisers and includes a complete breed and variety index. Winners of ABA awards are listed in the yearbook under Who's Who In Bantams. Starred wins are earned by Champions and Reserve Champions in any bantam class when a number of birds in the class is 100 or more. A single bird is eligible for only one award and can earn only one starred win. Awards are subject to change.

RABBIT & CAVY RULES - OPEN & YOUTH

This is an official A.R.B.A. Show.

1. The Small Animal Show Rules and State and Local Rules, found elsewhere in this book, apply to this Department. Please read them carefully.
2. Rules, definitions and judging procedures, as prescribed in the latest edition of the Standard of Perfection from the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. shall apply to the San Diego County Fair Rabbit Show, provided they do not conflict with any of the State Rules.
3. **JUDGING:** Rabbits and Cavies that are entered in the wrong class and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibits in the variety.
4. A judge may disqualify a rabbit from competition because of temporary or curable defects or viciousness, but the rabbits will be counted as an entry.
5. All cage locks must be removed by the exhibitor prior to judging. Failure to do so will prevent the rabbit from being judged.
6. All rabbits must be identified by permanent ear markings in the left ear conforming to the information on the entry form. Animals not marked with legible and permanent tattoo or ear band will be barred from competition. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same class will be disqualified from competition. Animals must be tattooed or banded prior to delivery. At time of check-in, all rabbits to have correct coop number placed in the rabbits right ear. Failure to do so will disqualify the rabbit from competition. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have this done before rabbits are cooped.
7. Exhibitor must name the breed and/or color on the entry form when entering in any A.V. or A.O.V. Division. NOTE: The Miscellaneous Division of Heavyweight or Lightweight Breeds will apply to all standard breeds as prescribed by the latest edition of the A.R.B.A. Inc. Standard of Perfection. They will be judged as one Division, regardless of the number of entries, breed or variety.
8. If an animal is quarantined prior to judging it will not be allowed on the show table.

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally, It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be approved by a licensed veterinarian.
5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

2010 Local Rules

1. Presentation of completed entry form shall be deemed acceptance of all rules. Acceptance includes permission to use your name, photograph and exhibit for the media.
2. Incomplete or incorrect entry forms may be returned at the discretion of the management. The management is not responsible for errors on entry forms which may lead to elimination or disqualification of an entry.
3. If the check for the processing fees is refused by the bank, a penalty of \$25 per check must be paid prior to the judging and/or may result in disqualification. Any or all premiums won will be held until fees and penalty are paid
4. The management reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable in any way, requires an excessive amount of space, or the capacity of the department has been reached. All material used in decorating booths or exhibits must comply with State Fire codes. No entry will be accepted where the exhibitor describes conditions under which he/she will exhibit or the exhibit will be displayed.
5. Registration is required in all departments and some one-day-contests. On-line entries are accepted until 5:00 pm (PDT) on the deadline day. Mailed in entry forms and processing fees must be USPS postmarked on or before the entry deadline. Entries postmarked on the closing date must be received 10 calendar days after the deadline. Any entry form received after this time, regardless of postmark, will not be accepted. Only official USPS postmarks will be used to determine eligibility. The Fair is not responsible for any lost or misdirected mail.
6. Exhibits must be delivered on the date(s) and times specified. Exhibits will not be accepted before or after the stated delivery date. All accepted exhibits must remain on display and shall not be removed until date specified in the rules. Any exhibit not picked up on specified date becomes the property of the San Diego County Fair and will be disposed of promptly.
7. Substitutions may only be made in the original Division and Class, unless otherwise noted in the Department rules.
8. All attendants at exhibits must be neatly attired, wear shoes and conduct themselves in a quiet and orderly manner.
9. All premium money will be paid from the awards as marked by the judges in the official judging books and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. The San Diego County Fair assumes no responsibility for special awards offered by clubs, individuals, or sanctioning bodies.
10. All premium and auction checks will be made payable to the exhibitor as listed on the entry form. Checks will be mailed within 30 days after the close of the Fair to the address shown on the entry form. Auction checks may be held longer if the buyer has not paid. Checks not cashed within 12 months from the date of issue will be forfeited. Replacement checks may be subject to a \$25 stop payment fee.
11. Requests for refunds must be submitted in writing, in accordance with State Rules. Refunds under \$10 will not be granted.
12. The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) is required by the Internal Revenue Service to report any premiums paid totaling the amount of \$600 or more. Exhibitors may be required to submit a W-9 form.
13. All exhibits are entered and shown at the owner's risk. Reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage to exhibits, but in no event will the 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur or for the actions of third parties. Insurance, if desired, should be obtained by the exhibitor at his/her own expense
14. The management reserves the right to limit entries, and display thereof, to facilities available and to cancel any division or class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition. Classes may be closed when capacity is reached.
15. Exhibitor must be living at the time the entry form is submitted.
16. All non-livestock entries must be the creative work of the exhibitor.
17. Any person who violates any Local, State or Department rule or displays unethical conduct will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the District may order.
18. The American System of Judging will be used in the Adult Divisions and the Danish System of Judging will be used in the Youth Divisions, unless otherwise stated.
19. Youth exhibitors must be 5 years of age by January 1, 2010, and not older than 17 years on June 1, 2010, unless otherwise stated in Department Information.
20. The 22nd District Agricultural Association management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, as in its judgment, may be deemed advisable. The 22nd District Agricultural Association (San Diego County Fair) assumes no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.
